

HARDY KIWI ARCTIC BEAUTY PASHA™ Actinidia kolomikta 'Pasha'™




Fruits measure about 3/4" long and are the first kiwis to ripen in early August. You eat them like a grape, tender skin. Also a fine ornamental vine with strikingly colourful foliage. Kiwis require a male and female plant for pollination. Male plant.

HARDY KIWI ARCTIC BEAUTY SEPTEMBER SUN™

Actinidia kolomikta 'September Sun'



September Sun™ Arctic Beauty kiwi produces good crop of large, sweet and flavourful fruit and is also prized for its colorful foliage. Make sure to pair with a Pasha™ for pollination. One male will pollinate up to 8 female kiwis. Female plant.





NATIVE SASKATOON Amelanchier alnifolia



🆐 🌋 🐧 3 m / 10′ ↔ 2 m / 6′

Hardy, native shrub with leathery, green leaves and creamy-white spring flowers, followed by edible blue berries and orange fall foliage. Self fertile. Harvest in early summer.







1 3 m / 10' ↔ 2 m / 6' COPF

Exceptionally large, juicy, blue berries in large clusters with very good flavour. A compact bush with high productivity. Harvest in early summer.







1 3 m / 10' ↔ 2 m / 6'

Largest fruit available. An improved selection of Thiessen with larger blue berries, uniform ripening and compact form. A heavy producer. Harvest in early summer.



NORTHLINE SASKATOON Amelanchier alnifolia 'Northline'



1 2m/6' ↔ 2m/6'

A favourite with many growers for its wonderful flavour and large, blue berries. Harvest in early summer.



SMOKEY SASKATOON Amelanchier alnifolia 'Smokey'



1 3 m / 10' ↔ 2 m / 6'

It offers good flavour, consistent fruiting with large, blue berries. It is ideal for hedge planting. Harvest in early summer.



THIESSEN SASKATOON Amelanchier alnifolia 'Thiessen'



1 3 m / 10' ↔ 2 m / 6'

Early flowering variety which is a favourite for eating fresh. The large, blue berries has a mild, pleasant flavour. Harvest in early summer.



JERSEY KNIGHT ASPARAGUS Asparagus 'Jersey Knight'



1.25 m / 4' ↔ 60 cm / 24"

A high yielding plant that will produce large, edible spears at an earlier age. Excellent flavour. Harvest in early spring.





1 90 cm / 36" ↔ 60 cm / 24"

One of the highest repetitive yielding male hybrids available to the home gardener. Produces medium spears in early spring.



PURPLE PASSION ASPARAGUS Asparagus 'Purple Passion'



1 90 cm / 36" ↔ 60 cm / 24"

Dark purple spears makes this a standout variety. A heavy yielding plant producing a sweet and nutty flavour. Earlier than most varieties. Spears turn green when cooked.

SWEET PURPLE ASPARAGUS Asparagus 'Sweet Purple'



1 m / 3' ↔ 60 cm / 2'

Longer, thicker stalks are savory and stingless from tip to base. This abundant long lived producer has more sugar than its green cousins. Sprinkle spears with lemon juice just before cooking to help retain colour.



ALBION STRAWBERRY Fragaria 'Albion'



15 cm / 6" ↔ 30 cm / 12" CPBR#3026, USPP#16228

An everbearing variety producing two heavy crops per year. First at the end of June, followed by the second in September. Fruit is long, conical and firm with excellent flavour.



KENT STRAWBERRY Fragaria 'Kent'



15 cm / 6" ↔ 30 cm / 12"


This variety produces one major crop in June. Produces large, bright red fruit with a great taste.





15 cm / 6" ↔ 30 cm / 12" cpbr#0208, USPP#7614

An everbearing variety producing two heavy crops per year. First at the end of June, followed by the second in September. High quality, very sweet berries, producing round and even shaped fruit.





TRISTAR STRAWBERRY Fragaria 'Tristar'



15 cm / 6" ↔ 30 cm / 12"

This variety produces fruit from end of June until fall frost (day neutral). Medium, very firm fruit. Very good for eating fresh and freezing.

LEIKORA SEABERRY (SEA BUCKTHORN)

Hippophae rhamnoides 'Leikora'



1 2 m / 6' ↔ 1.5 m / 5'

Plants with large clusters of tasty, sweet orange berries that persist well into winter. Sweetness intensifies with the return of cold weather in fall. Very high in vitamin C. Female plant. Male pollinator required.



POLLMIX SEABERRY (SEA BUCKTHORN)

Hippophae rhamnoides 'Pollmix'



1 2 m / 6' ↔ 1.5 m / 5'

Attractive rugged fine silvery foliage provides excellent texture and contrast in the landscape. Suitable for xeriscaping applications. Male pollinator for above variety. Pollinating ratio of 1:6 male to female is recommended. Male plant.







Fast growing, disease resistant. Remarkable flavor frozen or fresh. Harvest late July.









TUNDRA HONEYBERRY Lonicera caerulea 'Tundra'

1.25 m / 4' ↔ 1.25 m / 4' Spring cPBR#4923, USPP#11747

Fast growing, high yielding berry that is well suited for commercial production. Requires cross-pollination.

AURORA HASKAP Lonicera edulis kam. 'Aurora'



1.5 m / 5' ↔ 1.25 m / 4' CPBRAF

A large fruiting selection with a sweeter flavour when compared to others. Fast growing. Ripens mid-late July. Will cross-pollinate with all other Haskaps.





BOREAL BEAUTY HASKAP Lonicera edulis kam. 'Boreal Beauty'

1.75-2.25 m / 6-8' ↔ 1.25 m / 4' CPBRAF

Fast growing, disease resistant, selected for its very late harvest period. Harvest late July to early August. Pollinator required.



BOREAL BLIZZARD HASKAP Lonicera edulis kam. 'Boreal Blizzard'

Fast growing, disease resistant. Harvest in early to mid July. Pollinator required.





BOREALIS HASKAP Lonicera edulis kam. 'Borealis' (9-94)



1.25 m / 4' ↔ 1.25 m / 4' CPBR#4922

Large, blue berries and best tasting fruit, great for homeowner. Harvest in June. Will cross-pollinate with Aurora / Honeybee.



HONEY BEE HASKAP Lonicera edulis kam. 'Honey Bee'



Great for eating fresh in early June or for processing. A larger selection that is fast growing. A recommended pollinizer with a unique taste. Will cross-pollinate with all other Haskaps.



INDIGO GEM HASKAP Lonicera edulis kam. 'Indigo Gem' (9-15)



1.25 m / 4' ↔ 1.25 m / 4'

Great blue berries with good flavour. Can be dried for snacks. Excellent for homeowner or commercial use. Harvest in June. Will cross-pollinate with Aurora / Honeybee.



INDIGO TREAT HASKAP Lonicera edulis kam. 'Indigo Treat' (9-91)



Excellent tasting. Large, elongated, firm blue fruit. Harvest in June. Will cross-pollinate with Aurora / Honeybee.





BATTLEFORD APPLE Malus 'Battleford'



\$ 5 m / 16' ↔ 5 m / 16'

Top rated Prairie selection for its hardiness and reliable fruit production. Fruit is yellow and dull red with a juicy, white flesh. Pollinator required. Harvest in late August.

COLLET APPLE Malus 'Collet'



\$ 5 m / 16' ↔ 4 m / 13'

An excellent choice for eating fresh, pies and sauces. Medium size fruit is green with red streaking. A older cold hardy variety with high disease resistance. A western Manitoba introduction. Pollinator required. Harvest mid September.





DEXTER JACKSON APPLE Malus 'Dexter Jackson'

1 5 m / 16' ↔ 4-5 m / 13-16'

Fruits are average size and are amber in colour with red streaking. Dexter is a heavy annual producer with a strong branching habit and desirable form. Pollinator required. Harvest in mid August.


GEMINI® APPLE Malus 'Gemini'®



1 5 m / 16' ↔ 4 m / 13' USPP#24091

Crisp, juicy sweet fruit makes this a popular choice for eating fresh. Good sized fruit is yellow with red overlay. Developed by Art Coutts of Unity, Saskatchewan. Pollinator required. Harvest late August.





GLENORA APPLE Malus 'Glenora'



1 3.6-4.5 m / 12-15' ↔ 4.5-6 m / 15-20'

Tastes similar to 'Goodland'. Deep red color. Ripens late August.



GLORIA APPLE Malus 'Gloria'



Medium sized red speckled fruit with sweet and slightly spicy strawberry flavor. Similar to Norkent with better disease resistance.






GOODLAND APPLE Malus 'Goodland'



1 5 m / 16' ↔ 5 m / 16'


Superb cold hardy tree producing crisp, tender apples. Fruit is larger than average and green in colour with a red blush. Pollinator required. Harvest in mid September.



HARCOURT APPLE Malus 'Harcourt'



A full hardy tree with medium-sized, red with light streaks fruit always in abundance. A pleasantly flavoured apple which is deserving of much wider use. Pollinator required. Harvest in late August.




HARDI-MAC APPLE Malus 'Hardi-Mac'



1 5 m / 16' ↔ 5 m / 16'

A green apple with strong red similar to its well-known parent. Will perform best if sheltered from strong winds. Pollinator required. Harvest in late August



HONEYCRISP APPLE Malus Honeycrisp



1 5 m / 16' ← 4-5 m / 13-16' CPBR#1007, USPP#7197

Large fruit is mottled red over yellow and has an exceptionally crisp texture and excellent flavour. Pollinator required. Harvest in mid September.



NORKENT APPLE Malus 'Norkent'



1 5 m / 16' ↔ 4-5 m / 13-16'


A large fruiting variety, similar in taste to a Golden Delicious. The fruit is red over pale yellow and stores very well. Pollinator required. Harvest in late August.

NORLAND APPLE Malus 'Norland'



\$ 5 m / 16' ↔ 4-5 m / 13-16'

Early green selection with red stripes and a creamy-white flesh. Fruit can be stored for up to 16 weeks if picked when not fully ripe. Heavy producer on a naturally dwarf tree. Pollinator required. Harvest in mid August.







ODYSSEY® APPLE Malus 'Odyssey'®

1 6 m / 20' ↔ 3 m / 10'

Highly desirable crisp, sweet apples are a delight to eat. Fruit is medium size with a dull red overlay. Pollinator required. Harvest late August.

PARKLAND APPLE Malus 'Parkland'

1 5 m / 16' ↔ 4-5 m / 13-16'

Fruit is pale vellow with red blush and has a crisp, white flesh. Stores approximately 8 weeks in cold storage. Pollinator required. Harvest in mid August.



PRAIRIE MAGIC® APPLE Malus 'Prairie Magic'®

1 5 m / 16' ↔ 4 m / 13'

The medium to large fruit is green with a red overlay and has a sharp, crisp flesh. Good cold hardiness. Pollinator required. Harvest in mid September.



PRAIRIE SENSATION APPLE Malus 'Prairie Sensation'

Produces large fruit up to 8.5 cm (3") in diameter and is green with a red overlay. Flesh is firm, juicy and crisp. Pollinator required. Harvest in mid September.



PRAIRIE SUN APPLE Malus 'Prairie Sun'

1 5 m / 16' ↔ 5 m / 16' COPF

A semi-dwarf tree with a distinctive yellow skin with pink blush. It is an easy grower that produces consistent annual crops of apples. Pollinator required. Harvest in late August.



RED SPARKLE APPLE Malus 'Red Sparkle'

Fruit averages 7 cm (2.5") in size and is green and bright red with a white flesh. Makes an excellent dessert apple. Pollinator required. Harvest in late August.



STRATHCONA GOLD APPLE Malus 'Strathcona Gold'

2.5" golden, crisp and juicy eating apple. Ripens mid-season.



ZESTAR® APPLE Malus 'Zestar'®

\$ 5 m / 16' ↔ 4 m / 13' CPBR#2995, USPP#11367

An early season apple with a crisp juicy texture. It is know for its hint of brown sugar taste.



COMBINATION APPLE Malus Multi-Graff

\$ 5 m / 16'

4 m / 13'

Ideal for yards where space is limited. The multi-graft apple provides the convenience of several cross-pollinating varieties on one tree. Several combinations are available. No pollinator required.





1 3.6-4.5 m / 12-15' ↔ 3.6-4.5 m / 12-15'

Excellent pollinator. 2" pale yellow crabapples with sweet, nut-like flavor. Great for eating, cooking or making jellies.





KERR CRABAPPLE Malus 'Kerr'

1 5 m / 16' ↔ 4 m / 13'

Purple-red fruit slightly larger than average. Is best if picked after a light frost as flavour is at its best. Pollinator required. Harvest in mid September.

RESCUE CRABAPPLE Malus 'Rescue'



1 5 m / 16' ↔ 5 m / 16'

Fruit is a dull red with a sweet flavour and average 3-4 cm (1-1.5") in size. Pollinator required. Harvest in mid August.





TRAIL CRABAPPLE Malus 'Trail'



1 5 m / 16' ↔ 4 m / 13'

A sweet, pale yellow fruit with red blush and juicy, white flesh. A favourite among children with its sweet flavour. Pollinator required. Harvest in mid September.


CASINO APRICOT Prunus 'Casino'



1 4m/13' +> 2m/6'

Attractive orange-yellow freestone fruits are excellent for eating or preserves. Suitable pollinator for Westcot with similar attributes. Developed on the prairies. Harvest mid-August.





WESTCOTT APRICOT Prunus 'Westcott'



1 4m/13' ↔ 2m/6'

Produces large, yellow-orange, freestone fruit. Excellent for eating fresh or canning. Pollinator required. Harvest in mid August.

CARMINE JEWEL DWARF SOUR CHERRY

Prunus x kerrasis 'Carmine Jewel'



\$ 2.5 m / 8' ↔ 2 m / 6'

Attractive small tree or shrub with glossy foliage and round dark purple fruit. Eating fresh, preserves, or wine. Harvest in July-August. Self-pollinating.





CRIMSON PASSION DWARF SOUR CHERRY

Prunus x kerrasis 'Crimson Passion'



1 2 m / 6' ↔ 1 m / 3' CPBR#4852

Self fertile compact tree or shrub. Large sweet, dark red cherries excellent for eating fresh. Very high sugar content. Harvest in early to mid August.

CUPID DWARF SOUR CHERRY Prunus x kerrasis 'Cupid'



1 2.5 m / 8' ↔ 2 m / 6' CPBR#4853

Large, deep red cherries in August-September. Great for fresh eating. No pollinator required.





JULIET DWARF SOUR CHERRY Prunus x kerrasis 'Juliet'



1 2.5 m / 8' ↔ 2 m / 6' CPBR#4110

Large, deep red cherries in early, mid August. Great for fresh eating. No pollinator required.

ROMEO DWARF SOUR CHERRY Prunus x kerrasis 'Romeo'



1 2.5 m / 8' ↔ 2 m / 6' CPBR#4854

Produces large, dark red-black fruit in August-September. Great for fresh eating. No pollinator required. Highly productive.



EVANS SOUR CHERRY Prunus 'Evans'



1 3 m / 10' ↔ 2.5 m / 8'

Large shrub or small tree producing an abundance of semi-sweet, bright red cherries ideal for eating fresh, preserves and wine. Self-pollinating. Harvest in July-August.

CONVOY CHERRY PLUM Prunus x 'Convoy'



1 2.5 m / 8' ↔ 2 m / 6'

A cross between a cherry and a plum, produces medium-sized bright red fruit in early September, great for canning and jam or fresh eating.



MANOR CHERRY PLUM Prunus x 'Manor'



1 2.5 m/8' ↔ 2 m/6'

Small, purple-red fruit that is delicious and juicy. Excellent for preserves and fresh eating. Harvest in early September.





1 2m/6' ↔ 2m/6'

Spectacular display of white flowers in spring followed by bright red berries in mid July. Pollinator required.





WHITE NANKING CHERRY Prunus tomentosa 'Leucocarpa'



1 2m/6' ↔ 2m/6'

The fruits are showy white carried in abundance in mid/late July, which are excellent for making jams and jellies and wine-making. This is a self-pollinating variety.





2.5 m / 8' ↔ 2 m / 6'

Vertical staggered blooms of pink smother plant in spring before attractively textured green foliage emerges. Ideal tangy fruits for preserves and wine. Self-pollinating.





ROCKY MOUNTAIN SAND CHERRY Prunus besseyi



1 1 m / 3' ↔ 45 cm / 18"

White, single flowers followed by an abundance of large, sweet flavoured, dark purple berries in August. Fruit are good for preserving with very tart taste.

BROOKGOLD PLUM Prunus 'Brookgold'



High quality thin, golden-yellow skinned fruit with good flavour. Fruit is freestone and very sweet. Pollinator required. Harvest in late August.





BROOKRED PLUM Prunus 'Brookred'



\$ 5 m / 16' ↔ 4 m / 13'

A vigorous grower and heavy producer of dark red, high quality fruit. Pollinator required. Harvest in late August.

PEMBINA PLUM Prunus 'Pembina'



1 5 m / 16' ↔ 4 m / 13'

Large, thick, dark purple skinned fruit is juicy with a yellow flesh. Pollinator required. Harvest in late August.





QUEEN OF HEARTS PLUM Prunus 'Queen of Hearts'



1 5 m / 16' ↔ 4 m / 13' PPAF

Similar to Pembina but with larger fruit. This is one of the most flavourable plums grown for the prairies.

TECUMSEH PLUM Prunus 'Tecumseh'



1 4 m / 13' ↔ 4 m / 13'

A Japanese Plum that bears an abundance of showy deep purple-red drupes with a juicy red flesh. An annual heavy producer. A prairie hardy cultivar that has been around for years. Pollinator required.





TOKA PLUM Prunus 'Toka'



1 2.5 m / 8' ↔ 2.5 m / 8'

An excellent pollinator that produces medium sized, rich flavoured, reddish-bronze fruit. Pollinator required. Harvest in late August.


MOUNT ROYAL PLUM Prunus domestica 'Mount Royal'



1.5-3 m / 5-10' ↔ 1.5-3 m / 5-10'

Mount Royal Plum is a hardy fruit tree that has showy white flowers in the spring that are followed by blue fruit in late August. This variety is self-pollinating, and does not require another plum to set fruit. The fruit is excellent for canning and jams.





EARLY GOLD PEAR Pyrus 'Early Gold'



1 6 m / 20' ↔ 5 m / 16' COPF, CPBRAF

It will produce the most consistent greenish-yellow fruit for eating. Pollinator required. Harvest in mid September.





Produces small, yellow with red blush fruit with a juicy yellow flesh with good flavour. Pollinator required. Harvest in late September.





URE PEAR Pyrus 'Ure'



1 6 m / 20' ↔ 5 m / 16'

Juicy, small sized, green-yellow fruit is flavourful. Strong habit adds to the spring floral display. Pollinator required. Harvest in mid September.







1 6 m / 20' ↔ 4 m / 13' CPBR#4271

This is a selection from Paul Hamer at Saskatoon Farm in Alberta. It bears larger fruit and also has very upright columnar branching suitable for confined spaces. An excellent new introduction!



CANADA RED RHUBARB Rheum 'Canada Red'



\$ 90 cm / 36" ↔ 90 cm / 36"

Vigorous, heavy producer. Vivid red stalks with juicy and red flesh. Harvest in July. Cut at the base of the stems.


GERMAN WINE RHUBARB Rheum 'German Wine'



1 1 m/3' ↔ 1.25 m/4'

Green stalks with pink speckling. One of the sweetest varieties available. Superior vigor and taste when compared to red varieties.





STRAWBERRY RHUBARB Rheum 'Strawberry'

1 1 m / 3' ↔ 1.25 m / 4'

Stalks can vary from pink to red with similar interior colour. Medium to heavy stalk production. Often used as replacement for Victoria variety.


HINNOMAKI RED GOOSEBERRY Ribes 'Hinnomaki Red'



1 1 m/3' ↔ 2 m/6'

A popular choice with many gardeners for its high producing qualities of flavourable, large red fruit in mid-summer. May be used for baking and desserts.





PIXWELL GOOSEBERRY Ribes hirtellum 'Pixwell'



1.25 m / 4' ↔ 1.25 m / 4'

Excellent producer of green/pink fruit for jelly and wine. Also brilliant burgundy fall colour. Harvest in mid-summer.



BEN CONAN BLACK CURRANT Ribes nigrum 'Ben Conan'



1 90 cm / 36" ↔ 90 cm / 36" CPBR#2360, USPP#9975

Extremely large, black berries are very flavourful. Harvest in mid-summer.



BEN SAREK BLACK CURRANT Ribes nigrum 'Ben Sarek'



1 90 cm / 36" ↔ 90 cm / 36"

Compact bush with large, black, high-yielding fruit. Harvest in mid-summer.



RED LAKE CURRANT Ribes rubrum 'Red Lake'



1 2m/6' ↔ 2m/6'

Very dark red fruit that ripens in mid-summer. Vigorous shrub and mildew resistant.



AUBIN BLACK RASPBERRY Rubus 'Aubin Black'



1.5 m / 5' ↔ 1.25 m / 4'

Hardy vigorous grower producing good quality, black fruit for preserves or eating fresh. Harvest in July.



BOYNE RASPBERRY Rubus 'Boyne'



Large sweet, red fruit produced on same year wood. Great for eating fresh, freezing or preserves. Harvest in July.



DOUBLE DELIGHT RASPBERRY Rubus 'Double Delight'



1.25 m / 4' ↔ 1.25 m / 4'

A primocane with large, red berries having a sharp delightful flavor produced on same year wood. Harvest late summer/fall.




FALL GOLD RASPBERRY Rubus 'Fall Gold'



1.25 m / 4' ↔ 1.25 m / 4'

Two crops per year, summer/fall. Fruit is large, yellow with very sweet flavor and very juicy.





HERITAGE RASPBERRY Rubus 'Heritage'



1 m/3' ↔ 1 m/3'

An everbearing variety producing a moderate harvest in the summer followed by a heavier crop in the fall. Large, red berries provide very good flavour and firmness.

HONEY QUEEN RASPBERRY Rubus 'Honey Queen'



1 2 m / 6' ↔ 1.25 m / 4'

Known for its sweet honey flavour and unique yellow color. It prefers full sun but can tolerate some shade.



RED RIVER RASPBERRY Rubus 'Red River'



1 1 m/3' ↔ 1 m/3'

A primocane with red, sweet fruit harvested on same year wood. Heavy producer. Harvest in late summer.

ROYALTY RASPBERRY Rubus 'Royalty'



1 1 m / 3' ↔ 1 m / 3'

Large fruit with a purple colour with a light, sweet flavour when ripe, usually mid-July. Low suckering habit and very good adaptability. Good substitute for black raspberries when hardiness is a problem.





WYOMING BLACK RASPBERRY Rubus 'Wyoming'



1.25 m / 4' ↔ 90 cm / 36"

A non-suckering, black raspberry with a pleasing flavour. Harvest in mid-summer.



CHESTER THORNLESS BLACKBERRY Rubus fruticosus 'Chester'



1.5 m / 5' ↔ 1.5 m / 5'

Medium to large, round, black, sweet berries for eating fresh or preserves and wine. Cut back after bearing fruit. Harvest in August-September.



WILD RED RASPBERRY Rubus idaeus



1 1-1.2 m / 3-4' ↔ 1-1.25 m / 3-4'

Bloom season May-June. Fruit is very tasty.



CHIPPEWA BLUEBERRY Vaccinium 'Chippewa'



1 1 m / 3' ↔ 1 m / 3'

It produces large, blue berries with a sweet flavour in mid-summer.



NORTHBLUE BLUEBERRY Vaccinium 'Northblue'



1 1 m / 3' ↔ 1 m / 3'

Fruit is blue, large, attractive with a good blueberry flavour. Harvest in mid-summer.





1 1 m / 3' ↔ 1 m / 3'

Large, blue berries with sweet mild flavour in mid-summer. Excellent selection for eating fresh.





POLARIS BLUEBERRY Vaccinium 'Polaris'

1 1 m/3' ↔ 1 m/3'

It produces a large, very firm, sweet scented berries in mid-summer. Popular for its long storage properties.


BETA GRAPE Vitis 'Beta'



1 2m/6' ↔ 1m/3'

Extremely cold hardy producing blue-black fruits which are popular for jams, jellies and juice. Good annual producer.





EONA GRAPE Vitis 'Eona'



1 2 m / 6' ↔ 1.25 m / 4'


Hardy white grape that ripens in September. Good for table use or wine.

Vigorous growing red grape that ripens in September.




MARECHAL FOCH GRAPE Vitis 'Marechal Foch'

An old favorite wine grape for colder climates that's still in use commercially to produce a deep purple fruity wine, early ripening; a vigorous vine, use as a screen for arbors or trailing along fences, requires regular pruning and full sun.



MINNESOTA 78 GRAPE Vitis 'Minnesota 78'

Very sweet, red-purple variety. Ripens in September. Good for red wine, jellies and juice.




BLUE ICE GRAPE Vitis 'Morden Concord'



1 2 m / 6' ↔ 1 m / 3'

One of the hardiest table grape varieties, produces large blue grapes that become incredibly sweet and juicy in fall. A vigorous vine, use as a screen for arbors or trailing along fences, require regular pruning and full sun.



PRAIRIE STAR GRAPE Vitis 'Prairie Star'



A late season sweet white grape that makes a suitable table wine, also excellent for eating fresh. Self-fruiting.



SEVERNJI GRAPE Vitis 'Severnji'

Very juicy, red grape are excellent for wine, juice or jams. Ripens in September. Pollinator required.
